

English as a Second Language is designed to provide additional help for students who require assistance in acquiring a foundation in the English language.

A school may offer a program of English as a Second Language if circumstances dictate.

- 1. The local school is under no obligation to provide an E.S.L. program.
- 2. The local school Principal will determine the need for an E.S.L. program, and if required will provide the Local School Council with details outlining the time commitment and staffing.
- 3. A school E.S.L. program may vary in length and intensity depending on the student needs.
- 4. Written parental approval is required before students are registered in an E.S.L. program.
- 5. A user fee may be required for participation in an E.S.L. program.
- 6. The program may be either incorporated into the existing timetable or taught as an extra-curricular program.
